Dr. Cray has a M.A. in Accounting from Ball State University; a M.B.A. in Economics from Ball State University; and a Ph.D. in Economics from Kansas State University. Dr. Cray has published in a number of scholarly journals, which deal with regional economics. Moreover, he has published over two hundred Quarterly Economic Indicator Reports for Marathon, Portage, and Wood counties. He is currently a member of the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development's employment projection panel. Dr. Cray is a frequent speaker at professional conferences and is regularly interviewed by regional newspapers, radio, and television stations on matters pertaining to the economy.
