Project Ezra a Success for the Consumers and for the IARP Participants

Following the 2010 Forensic Conference, I had a strong desire to see the "Helping Hands Project" continue. Bob Pare initiated and led the project with a host of others contributing. The project was a huge success and a great way for IARP members to give back to the local community, many of whom were still feeling the effects of Hurricane Katrina.

As Chair of the 2011 conference in Las Vegas I knew that there must be a need in the local area that our expertise could fill. Bob Pare served to provide guidance and wisdom for developing the volunteer opportunities in New Orleans. Mike Blankenship graciously agreed to lead the project in Las Vegas. Ira Spector, one of our Las Vegas members, located an excellent opportunity and program for us to utilize our vocational and counseling skills. By both Mike and Ira working directly with Project Ezra, an excellent program was developed to assist local displaced workers with return to work skills. Nevada has the highest unemployment rate among U.S. States at 13.4 % (September 2011). This was only exceeded by the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico at 16.4%.

In review of the program, it was easy to determine that it matched our interests and skills. "Project Ezra is a program of the Jewish Family Service Agency created to provide solutions in response to the catastrophic impact of being economically disadvantaged. Ezra means "help" in Hebrew and the Jewish community has made a commitment to the entire community to be an agent of positive change focused on identifying viable vocational opportunities and preparing unemployed people to secure those opportunities. Beyond the critical goal of getting people back to work, Project Ezra also provides extensive educational and counseling services to help enable individuals to become more confident and self-sufficient. In order to contend with the crucible of unemployment and the affiliated trauma experienced from foreclosure, loss of health insurance, doubt and despair, Project Ezra's holistic approach engages and improves the emotional and intellectual aspects of people's personal challenges in order to assist them more effectively in achieving positive outcomes" (Project Ezra).

The program has served nearly 1,000 individuals in the last 4 years and has a 60% job placement rate. Although this project was started by Jewish Family Services Agency, it serves the entire local population. Their statistics show that the consumers served are approximately 60% Jewish and 40% non-Jewish.

Project Ezra offers a two day workshop for displaced workers. This was reduced to a one day program titled "Employment is a State of Mind - A Job Search Skills Workshop." They made us feel welcome and certainly important with their brochure for the program highlighting that the program would be "...led by top job coaches, rehabilitators and other professionals from around the world." They also offered participants to have their resumes analyzed by "...top experts from around the world." The "Helping Hands" volunteers from IARP were able to use vocational rehabilitation skills to assist the participants with job seeking skills, resume development, interviewing skills, networking skills and counseling in regard to the challenges of being chronically unemployed.

Awards given at 2011 IARP Forensic Conference

The annual presentation will include two awards to remember two former active IARP members and large contributors to the field of rehabilitation: Gale Gibson and Bart Hultine. We believe it is important to remember the contributions of these men and their dedication to the field of rehabilitation. Deb Holmes, IARP Board Education Chair presented the Gale Gibson IARP Educational Scholarship. Michelle Hultine provided the award for the fund dedicated to her father, Bart Hultine. They further provided a summary of the funds, the 2011 recipients, how to nominate for the 2012 awards and how to contribute to the causes.

2011 Gale Gibson IARP Educational Scholarship Recipient

Gale Gibson was an entrepreneur in the field of occupational databases and was very generous with his time and his knowledge. In honor of his memory, IARP, along with his family, have instituted a scholarship in his name. The goal of the scholarship fund is twofold: to provide funding for IARP members for professional growth opportunities and to provide scholarship recipients venues to share their new knowledge.

Our first scholarship recipient is Alicia Hiles. Alicia is nearing completion of her Masters Degree in Vocational Rehabilitation Counseling at Emporia State. The scholarship will fund her final course Vocational Information and Assessment. IARP congratulates Alicia, who is also a new IARP member.

There will be two scholarship selections per year. Applications are available on the IARP website under the Education tab and are reviewed by the Education Committee in February and August. Members need to complete an application for a course or class, independent study or research project. Scholarships will be funded anywhere from \$100 to a maximum of \$1500, depending on funding availability.

CORE Update and Appointment

The Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) accredits approximately 96 university and college-based rehabilitation counselor education programs at the master's degree level. Accreditation serves to promote the effective delivery of rehabilitation services to people with disabilities by stimulating and fostering continual review and improvement of master's degree rehabilitation counselor education programs.

CORE was formed in 1971 and incorporated in 1972. Five professional rehabilitation organizations were originally represented on CORE: American Rehabilitation Association (ARA), formerly the International Association of Rehabilitation Facilities, American Rehabilitation Counseling Association (ARCA), Council of State Administrators of Vocational Rehabilitation (CSAVR), and National Council on Rehabilitation Education (NCRE), formerly the Council of Rehabilitation Counselor Educators, and National Rehabilitation Counseling Association (NRCA). Today, these five organizations—except ARA, which has been replaced by the National Council of State Agencies of the Blind (NCSAB) and two public members—comprise CORE and as such represent the professional and organizational constituencies concerned with the training, evaluation, and employment of rehabilitation counselors. Under CORE is the Commission on Standards and Accreditation which is responsible for accreditation reviews and recommendations to the CORE Board. Since the 1980's, IARP has two representatives to the Commission but no representation on the CORE Board.

The need for qualified and competent rehabilitation professionals in the private sector has continued to increase over the last several decades. IARP recognized the need to expose rehabilitation counseling students to private sector practices and has actively participated in the review and revision of CORE academic standards. In January 2011, IARP requested representation on the CORE Board as the organization is committed to supporting the importance of accreditation of masters level rehabilitation counselor education programs. In July 2011, CORE approved the addition of an IARP representative to the CORE Board.

Dr. Cherie King, CRC, CDMS has been appointed to represent IARP on the CORE Board. Dr. King completed two terms on the Commission of Standards and Accreditation, most recently as the Chair of the Commission. "The representation on CORE is a significant step for IARP. This demonstrates IARP's commitment to the continued development of relationships with universities, colleges, and other rehabilitation counseling organizations. More importantly, by having a seat at the table, IARP will continue to support and promote private rehabilitation knowledge and skills in Masters training programs to prepare students for the expanding career opportunities for rehabilitation counselors".

Dr. King is an Assistant Professor in the Professional and Rehabilitation Counseling program at Central Connecticut State University and a private rehabilitation counselor with over 20 years of experience in insurance, forensic, and disability management. She is the Past Chair of the Commission on Standards and Accreditation for the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE), Past Chair of the Commission on Disability Management Specialists Certification's (CDMSC) Exam and Research committee; Board of Directors for the American Rehabilitation Counseling Association; past member of the National Board of Directors of The International Association of Rehabilitation Professionals (IARP) and Past President of the New England IARP Chapter.
