

Collaboration, Education and Innovation from Ireland to Illinois

Association members and chapters are taking the lead in collaboration, research and development of the rehabilitation profession. One great example of how is this upcoming seminar.

The Title of the annual seminar of the IARP Illinois chapter is "The Future of Rehabilitation: Think Globally Act Locally". The seminar takes place during the chapter's Annual Meeting on September 9, 2013 in Naperville, Illinois.



<u>Dr. Alan Bruce</u> has been confirmed as a presenter. Dr. Bruce is the President of the IARP Ireland chapter and a sociologist. He studied and taught in Los Angeles, Galway, Amsterdam and Hull. After research for the European Commission in Brussels, in Ireland he was responsible for disability training and vocational rehabilitation. He collaborates with various US universities and teaches with the National University of Ireland Galway. Vice-President of the *European Distance and E-Learning Network*, he works on labor market policy, innovative education, distance learning, strategic change and managing diversity. In Europe he is centrally involved in innovative educational development, transformational school systems and enhanced use of ICT in schools. He is CEO of Universal Learning Systems (ULS), which operates in Ireland, Finland, the Netherlands and US.

Dr. Bruce's presentation is entitled *Shaping Future Rehabilitation Professionalism: Innovative Learning and Best Practice*. The overall goal of the presentation is to develop the skills and knowledge of participants in understanding the challenges of globalization, international best practice and continuing professional development needs in advanced vocational rehabilitation leadership through use of innovation and advanced elearning strategies

This dynamic and interactive session will look at the role of the rehabilitation professional in an environment of profound and sustained change. How can the professional remain informed, up-to-date and skilled in contexts of globalization, demographic transformation and the end of static job norms? Referencing international best practice and innovative e-learning technologies, it will outline pioneering developments in professional training, accessible CPD trends and development of sustainable networks that promote excellence and added value for modern professional rehabilitation specialists. Use will be made of exciting new European developments and examples.

<u>Elizabeth M. Watson</u>, MS, CRC, CCM, LCPC, CBIS; will be making a presentation entitled "Issues, Challenges and Threats Facing Rehabilitation Professionals" at the seminar as well. 
