The various types of injections can be mind boggling - - epidural steroid injections, facet and sacroiliac joint injections, medial branch blocks/chemical neurolysis, sympathetic blocks, radial frequency ablation/neurotomy, discography, peripheral nerve injections, peripheral joint injections, trigger point injections, percutaneous disc decompression.
